"Reformation Day & All Hallow's Eve"

The beauty of Fall is upon us -- crisp, cool mornings; kaleidescopes of foliage; and, of course, pumpkin spice everything. Along with all the harvest decroations, I've seen more and more skeletons. Scarecrows and hay bales make sense, but why so many skeletons? Halloween is one of America's biggest retail holidays, with around 4.2

billion dollars spent this year, just on decorations. There's even online debates on whether its more fun to decorate for Halloween than Christmas.

One of my kids asked me recently, "isn't Halloween the devil's holiday?" Well, actually it's not. The name itself points to a Christian origin. It comes from an early church tradition called "All Hallows Eve," the night before All Saints (Hallows) Day. It's a day to honor the faithful believers, whom the Bible calls "holy ones," which have entered into eternity. So, yes, death was always a part of this special day & night before. But not in relation to wandering spirits, ghosts, zombies, and graveyards; rather in light of Heaven and eternal rewards for faithful service to God. Quite a difference! In fact, most of our modern-day obervance comes from a Celtic



harvest festival where they sought to appease the dead with death-honoring activities (A practice St. Patrick directly confronted in the fifth century.)

For us Protestant Christians, October 31st takes on even more significance. The reformer Martin Luther posted his formal protest against the corruptions of Catholicism on this day in 1517 igniting the Reformation. It was as if he was saying to the Church, "to truly honor the saints of God who had come before us. we should evaluate whether

we're truly serving God with the same integrity." Do our lives reflect the same values of those on whose shoulders we stand? Are we in need of a "reformation"?

So how should Christians observe Halloween?

Aren't these decorations, candy, & costumes just in good fun? They are (mostly). And its encouraging to see families enjoying time together, and even interacting with neighbors. At the same time the Bible calls us to "be aware of Satan's schemes" (2 Cor 2:11; 1 Pet. 5:8). Here's a few traps the devil uses:

- Gory movies/images that glorify sin murder & violence, deception, sensuality
- The allure of the occult witchcraft, divination, demon possession
- Exposing young children to frightening images, desensitizing/normalizing evil

All of these are strictly forbidden in God's Word. God knows the invisible spiritual reality, and He knows the effect these traps can have on our hearts. Two extreme responses are (a) embrace the darkness or (b) avoid it completely. Neither is

helpful, so I suggest two things. First, an alternative to these extremes: bring light into the darkness. (Like the saints before us: And like our outreach in town on the 31st.)

Secondly, we need to guard our hearts. What seems innocent and fun can open our hearts or those around us to a world we never intended to enter. (Scan the QR code for a song that has

helped me to be more careful about what I allow in my heart by the band Ceili Rain called, "Junkyard".) May this season be marked by heart "reformations" more than creepy decorations. -- Journeying with you, Pastor Kyle

CHRISMON SERVICE

November 30th 9:00 AM

Chrismons, meaning "Christ monograms," traditionally are white and gold designs made from Christian symbols that signify Christ. Often displayed on an evergreen tree during the Christmas season, symbols such as stars, crosses, fish, crowns, and the alpha and omega remind us of Christ's identity, his story, and of the Holy Trinity. The white color in Chrismons is the liturgical color of Christmas and Easter that signifies joy and holiness. The gold represents the glory, majesty and kingship of Jesus.

Chrismons were first developed in 1957 by Frances Spencer and the women of the Ascension Lutheran Church in Danville, VA. "Mrs. Spencer stated a tree was never finished until someone came to see it and have the story of Christ explained to them through the ornaments".

"For the scripture says, Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame."

On our first day on the campus of UNC, a young man approached me and stated, "I hear what you are saying, I was born going to church, but I am missing something." As our conversation concluded I told him, "It is one thing to know about Jesus and another thing to know Him." One of my go to analogies to illustrate this is to say, "I can know about the president, but I do not know him as a person." A few weeks later, Jack came back to tell me, "I found God! I'm reading the Bible. I have been praying a lot and I'm going to church." Needless to say, he was very excited.

On this same campus, a student said, "Can I ask about your sign?" My gospel sign states "Do you have eternal life?" This started a great discussion on the importance of the resurrection of Jesus and also being willing to trust God. Lack of trust is a major issue in our culture of propaganda and disinformation. Some people have asked me if the murder of Charlie Kirk has had an impact on the campuses. All I can say is that a young man at NC State asked me for a Bible and we had a long conversation about the gospel. It seems his friends have been asking him to go to church, and he has declined their invitation numerous times, but the death of Charlie Kirk got him thinking about the condition of his soul.

I gave Mason a Bible and saw him the next week. He said, "I am reading through Matthew and writing stuff down." He is on the journey of coming to faith in Christ. Although I am no expert, there seems to be a growing interest in the gospel and going back to church on the campus. It is also awesome to see students out and about sharing their faith in Jesus. The Lord is always at work. In late August, it was back to the gridiron for college and professional football players as they prepare to entertain the millions of football fans Sports Fan Outreach International has a plan to have evangelists at every Division 1 and NFL stadium before the games. So far, there are forty-one stadiums covered in the USA. One of the stadiums is Carter Finley Stadium, the home of the North Carolina State Wolfpack. Each game day, approximately 55,000 fans head to the stadium in hopes of seeing another victory. So far, we have been to four games with teams of six to ten people, which means we can cover a lot of territory. At each game, we have various preaching locations and people ready to pass out gospel tracts to those who walk by. It is a busy three hours of nonstop activities. One cool thing is some of the students who see us on campus, also see us at the game, which opens up some conversations. It is hard to believe that the season is already half over, with three home games remaining.

The Wake County Courthouse services an area of over a million people and has become a frequent place of ministry. My good friend and ministry partner, Pat McClanahan, has been there numerous times to pass out gospel tracts and suggested that we go there. Surprisingly, there is some significant pedestrian traffic at this location. Over the weeks we have shared the gospel with, or prayed for people such as lawyers, police officers, wedding couples, jurists and those going to court. We have also met some amazing Christian people who encourage us and thank us for being there.

Just last week, Pat had a conversation with a young man who claimed to be a Christian yet was living with his female partner. Pat, being a bold guy, asked him, "When are you going to do the right thing before God and get married?" It is amazing what people will reveal to us as they open up their hearts in search of help.

Yesterday, a woman asked me to pray for her. She mentioned that her 18-year-old son is in jail, her 10-year-old had run away that morning, and her own life was without God as she had drifted away over the years from a childhood faith. I told her of her need to repent and come back to Christ. As we suggested a church she could attend near her home, a woman walking by overheard us and said, "That's a great church. I go there."

Blessed with lots of great gospel conversations at the courthouse. Did more one-on-one sharing than preaching as the Lord allowed us to engage many people in conversations. PTL.

NEWS FROM OUR MISSIONARIES

(This update from the Farr's arrived too late for publication in the October "The Manbeck Messenger". Their current Newsletter follows)

Farr Flyer:

The Islands will experience God's hope. A God sized movement crosses the Pacific

"Sing to the Lord a new song, his praise from the ends of the earth, you who go down to the sea, and all that is in it, your islands, and all who live in them. Let the wilderness and its towns raise their voices; let the settlements where Kedar lives rejoice. Let the people of Sela sing for joy; let them shout from the mountaintops. Let them give glory to the Lord and proclaim his praise in the islands." -/saiah 42:10-12

God is moving powerfully across the Pacific in ways that can only be described as His doing. Local churches are rising up to lead Bible translation, and communities are encountering Jesus in their own languages. It's a historic moment to stand in awe of how the Holy Spirit is transforming lives and equipping leaders across the islands.

In my role as Strategic Innovation Consultant for the Pacific, I've had the privilege of walking alongside church leaders, partners, and communities to help encourage and support this wave of locally led translation. What we are witnessing is not just projects beginning, but a Spirit-led movement that will shape generations.

In September, I was part of a training and gathering for Senior Facilitators of Church and Community Based Bible Translation from around the world. It was encouraging to meet so many from different contexts. All of these facilitators support work in different regions of the world. There are now hundreds of languages in different continents leveraging church-based authentication of scriptures. The facilitators come from Kenya, India, Philippines, PNG, Vanuatu, US, Peru, Fiji, and the Netherlands.

"How can a young person stay on the path of purity? By living according to your word. I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you. Praise be to you, Lord; teach me your decrees." Psalm 119:9-12

Our family has a lot of moving parts. We have experienced changes in jobs, schools, states, friendships and so much more. We celebrate that God is driving team Farr through times of chaos and calm. Our family is in God's hands, and we recognize that both the ministry and our family require outside input, support, encouragement and sometimes tune-ups as well.

Anita and I serve as the internal control unit and sensors in our "Farr Car" ensuring that different parts and functions are getting the right encouragement (lubrication so they don't get 'too hot'), the appropriate input so the engine "fires" and we move forward, the reporting so we know when parts are stressed through friction with each other or outside environments, the ears to hear when there are noises that indicates the car is not working optimally. Our family

requires frequent re-tuning! This year we have experienced different wear on parts, and yet we rejoice. We are thankful for the creator and master mechanic, Jesus, who provides us daily what we need even when we don't always see "fault codes" coming. At home and at work we are seeing new opportunities to trust God.

In our work with Wycliffe, we are participating in the greatest acceleration of scripture starts and active translation work in history. The engine for translation is driven by partnerships and energy from churches, agencies, and partners like you all over the world and fueled by prayer and partners working on many different moving pieces

Our midterm break has begun; we have finished our 6th week of school! **PRAY** that all students and staff will have a restful and fun few days. When our students return from midterm; we'll begin our annual Spiritual Emphasis Week (SEW) – five days of focused Worship and teaching from God's Word.



This year's theme, From Conformity to Transformation, comes from Romans 12:1-2, Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship.2 Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. Nigel and Jessie Paul, our speakers for this year, are the founders and directors of a ministry called Moveln Global, which encourages and supports Christians who prayerfully and intentionally move into unreached, urban poor neighborhoods around the globe (https://movein.global). There are 81 teams of approximately 400 "Moveln'ers" in 53 cities, 14 countries worldwide, who know about 20,000 people by name in the communities where they live.
